2018 RODEO QUEEN CONTEST
GENERAL QUALIFICATIONS & POLICY

Deadline: January 21, 2018 No late entries will be accepted!

1. Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association may be referred to as MCFLA throughout the following rules and policies.
2. All Contestants must be a citizen of the United States. All contestants must be a current resident of Matagorda County or enrolled in high school courses (9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade) at a home school, private school, or public school for the current year in Matagorda County.
3. Former Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association Rodeo Queens are ineligible to compete in the Rodeo Queen contest, but former contestants are eligible to compete in the contest. A contestant may not enter both the Fair Queen and Rodeo Queen Contest in the same year.
4. All contestants must be current and active members of 4-H, FFA, or FHA, and eligible under UIL Rules.
5. Applicant **Must** include a negative Coggins certificate for the horse that is to be used in the contestant with their application. The contestant must ride the horse listed on the application and that horse must have negative Coggins papers. "If" the horse listed on the original application becomes lame, that horse may be exchanged only if Bay City Vet or Palacios Veterinary Clinic has provided us with proof that the horse listed on the original paperwork is not able to be ridden. The contestant may change horses after providing the committee with the vet paperwork and new negative Coggins paperwork for the new horse to be used.
6. All contestants must be a single female, never have been married, never had a marriage annulled, never have given birth and never have been convicted of a felony prior to the contest. The contestant must be in good moral character and never have been convicted of any crime, with the exception of Class C Traffic offense. If the contestant violates the Controlled Substance Penal Code Act, she will be disqualified from this contest. These rules will remain intact throughout the reign of the Rodeo Queen and her runners-up. If any of these infractions occur then the crown and any awards will be forfeited.
7. Contestants are to be in good health. Good health is defined as adequate to fulfill duties of the Queen if selected. Each contestant will not hold the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association, County of Matagorda, or any individual or organization associated with the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association liable for any accident or injury that may or might occur as a result of the contest or future obligations. Release form must be signed and submitted with entry forms.
8. Each contestant must have a sponsor(s), and each sponsor fee will be \$50.00, payable to the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association, and due with the entry form on January 21, 2018.
9. Rodeo Queen Contestants are required to write a **short autobiography** to turn in with the entry forms. Do not use your last name or your family's names. It may be typed or handwritten and must be no more than one page in length. If typed, the print must be no smaller than 12 point. It should have at least 1 ½ spaces between the lines with one inch margins all around. The paper should contain information about you that you think best describes your character, why you want to be (or would be a good) Rodeo Queen and what your plans are for college and/or your future may be.
10. Rodeo Queen Contestants are required to turn in an additional **95 word arena introduction** that will be used by the EMCEE during the arena presentation. Anything that exceeds 95 words will be at the discretion of the royalty committee to remove words. Please use 3rd person narration. The contestant's name, horse, sponsor, parents, grade, school, fair and rodeo participation must be included. Additional information can include, but is not limited to, extracurricular activities, clubs, hobbies, awards, and future plans. **This will not be scored by the judges.**

11. There will be a **MANDATORY meeting on Sunday, January 21, 2018 at 2:00p.m.** in the Multi-Purpose Bldg. The only excused absence will be if the participant has a conflicting UIL event. Come with completed application and entry fees. **ALL** publicity photos will be taken at this time with no exceptions. There will be an opportunity to ask any questions and discuss the rules. If conflicting UIL event, application must be turned in completed to the Fair office by noon on January 19, 2018 with 2 - 4x6 picture (same picture). **No late or incomplete application forms will be accepted.**
12. **All Rodeo Queen Contestants are required to attend a MANDATORY Practice, Sunday, January 21, 2018 immediately following the Royalty meeting unless they provide proof of conflicting UIL event into fair office by noon on Friday January 19, 2018. In addition to this practice, the arena will be available for you to practice on Tuesday January 23rd, Tuesday January 30th and Tuesday February 6th in the indoor arena from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Contestants are required to attend 6 hours of practice after the mandatory practice on Sunday, January 21st. You are responsible for signing yourself in and out of practices on the provided time sheets at practice. 5 points will be deducted from your final score for every 30 minutes of time under 6 hours of required practice. NO FITTERS OR TRAINERS ARE TO BE AT ANY OF THE ABOVE PRACTICES. NO FITTERS OR TRAINERS ARE ALLOWED IN THE ARENA AREA OR WITHIN THREE FEET OF THE ARENA RAILING. Parents can assist their daughters at these practices. Parents are not allowed in the arena area unless authorized by MCFLA Royalty Committee.**
13. Rodeo Queen and her runner(s)-up must attend any function that is required by the Royalty Committee. The entire Rodeo Queen court will be required to ride after slack night as a practice run for the remaining rodeo. A point system will be kept for participation. (Awards, Parades, etc.)
14. All Rodeo Queen contestants will be **required to sell at least 10 signs at \$20.00 each.** All monies (\$200 per contestant) are **due on Friday February 16th prior** to contestant's interview. Checks can be made to MCFLA. **2 points will be deducted from final score for each sign not sold or money for each sign not turned in for each sign.**
15. Eligibility Master Listing will be used this year at the Fair for UIL requirements. We advise that you contact your school, public or private, to ensure you have been placed on the eligible or the ineligible list. Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association will not be responsible to advise anyone of their eligibility in advance of any contest. Home School and Private School students will still need to furnish an eligibility form to the Fair Office by **12:00 NOON, Friday, February 2, 2018** in order to participate in this contest.
16. Interviews will be held on **Friday February 16th at 7:00 pm at the Bay City Service Center.** Riding and Judging will be on **Saturday, February 17, 2018** at the Matagorda County Fairgrounds **at 10 a.m.** The arena will be **available at 9:00 am for warm-up but not prior to that time.** All contestants will be asked to stay until the awards ceremony is complete. Judges will not be related to any contestants and will be from out of the county.
17. Scoring will be as follows:

18. A Rodeo Queen and runner(s)-up will be announced immediately following the contest. If there are 4 participants, the Queen and a 1st Runner-up will be placed. If there are 5 contestants, the Queen, 1st Runner-up and 2nd Runner-up will be placed. If there are 6 or more contestants then the Queen, 1st Runner-up, 2nd Runner-up and 3rd Runner-up will be placed. Parents & friends will be allowed to take pictures of contestants **after** the Fair Photographer gets his/her pictures for 10 minutes. It is then mandatory to exit the arena so that the next event can commence.
19. The Rodeo Queen is required to wear her crown on a **cowboy hat**.
20. Queens shall not use foul language or have involvement in any illegal or illicit activities while serving.
21. The Fair Board and Manager have a **zero tolerance policy** in regards to drinking alcohol, MIP (minor in possession), smoking cigarettes, or any other drug abuse. If this rule is violated, it will result in immediate dismissal.
22. No financial reimbursement for transportation, expenses, etc. will be provided by the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association, unless approved by the Board of Directors.
23. The Rodeo Queen and runners-up will be presented on horseback each night of the rodeo, along with the Fair Queen, Fair Princess, Junior Fair Princess, Little Miss Cowgirl and Little Mister Cowboy. Runner(s) up will alternate carrying flags during the rodeo. The Queen will carry flags every night.
24. Rodeo Queen and the runner(s) up must attend any function that is required by the Queen's Committee. They are expected to participate in the parades, the Matagorda County Fair Livestock Show & Rodeo, and Livestock Auction on Saturday, March 3, 2018. You will receive an itinerary, with the events and times of all the events that you will be assisting in, from the Royalty Committee. Participation will be kept on a score sheet.
25. The contestant that is crowned Rodeo Queen of the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association must be available to attend any public event or function as a representative of the Association during the year of her reign. In addition, she must crown the next year's Rodeo Queen. The Rodeo Queen and the Fair Queen will be co-chairpersons responsible for the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association float that may be entered in various parades. They must be available to decorate and ride on the float in any parades represented by Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association. The Rodeo Queen will be sponsored in the Rice Festival Pageant, if she meets the requirements set by the Lions Club.
26. In the event the MCFLA pays any entry fee or expense money for a contestant that does not complete the contest, the contestant will be asked to reimburse the MCFLA for those expenses.
27. The queen will receive \$500.00 scholarship (all MCFLA scholarship rules apply). This check will be made available to her upon graduation from High School after providing a statement of tuition & fees or proof of enrollment in college to Fair office.
28. All contestants must allow the Matagorda County Fair & Livestock Association Committee to use photographs and important information submitted in the contest in news stories in advance of the contest finals. Pictures may be altered for reproduction purposes only.
29. If the Rodeo Queen is unable to fulfill her duties, due to circumstances found to be objectionable by the Board of Directors of the Fair Association, she will forfeit the crown and all awards. The 1st runner up will finish her reign and receive her \$500.00 scholarship or forfeit the scholarship and allowed to run for Rodeo Queen in the future unless she is a Senior in High School.

30. MCFLA Protest Procedures - All protests concerning Matagorda County Fair Entries must be submitted prior to judging and be accompanied by a \$150 cash deposit. The deposit will be returned ONLY if the protest is upheld. **Once judging has commenced NO protests will be accepted. The Judges decision is final and not subject for protest.** Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation. The protest will be reviewed by at least (5) members of the Fair Board. The ruling of the Fair Board Directors will be final. Both sides of the protest must be present at the time of the protest. There will be no anonymous protests accepted. Every exhibitor, in consideration of her entry being accepted by the Matagorda County Fair and Livestock Association, agrees that the conclusion reached by the Fair Board Directors shall be final, without any recourse against the Matagorda County Fair and Livestock Association, Board of Directors, Division Chairman, Superintendent, or Committeemen.
31. No scores will be released to any competitor. This is a board decision and is final.
32. ***Remember, you are a Fair and Rodeo Representative.*** You will be looked upon as a role model and an example to others. While the Fair Manager and Royalty Director have no right to ask you to give up any personal activities, they have every right to expect you to behave in a manner befitting your position. The Fair Board and Manager also have every right to remove a Queen if they feel she has shown misconduct.

REMINDER: UIL REQUIREMENTS APPLY!

You must be on your school's eligibility list (or have completed and turned in a home school/private school eligibility form to the Fair Office by noon on Friday, February 2, 2018 to be eligible to participate in the contest.

If participating in UIL event that conflicts, application will need to be received by **Friday, January 19th by noon in the fair office along with 2 of the same 4x6 photos and proof of UIL event.**
- All Rodeo Queen Contestants are required to attend a **mandatory** Practice, Sunday, January 21, 2018 following mandatory meeting in the Indoor Arena at the Fairgrounds as well as 6 hours of additional practices offered.
- Individual interviews will be held on **Friday, February 16, 2018** at the Bay City Civic Center. **\$200 profit from sign sales must be turned in prior to interview to avoid point deduction from final score.** The Riding competition will be held on **Saturday, February 18, 2017 starting at 10:00 am** at Rodeo Grounds inside arena. Have your horse saddled & ready to ride. The arena will be available for warm-up starting at 9:00 am.
- Parents & friends may attend the Riding competition and Awards Presentation, **Saturday, February 17, 2018** in the **Indoor Arena at 10:00 am.**



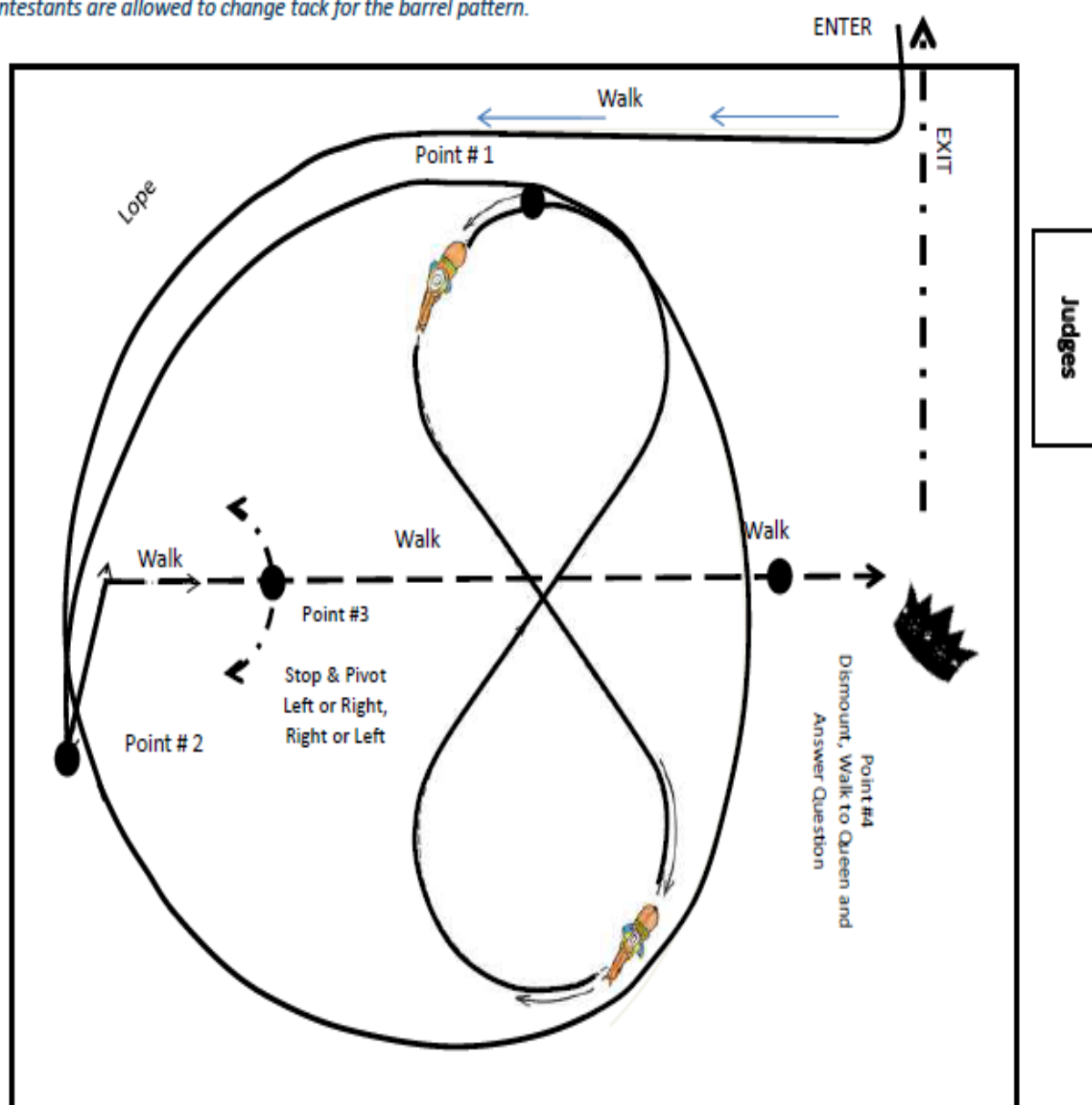

MCFLA Rodeo Queen Horsemanship Pattern

Enter the Arena at a walk to approximately point #1. After Point #1, increase your speed through the Horsemanship pattern to a fast canter/lope. As you exit your figure eight pattern stop at position #2, back your horse and turn, face judges. Walk to Point #3, stop and pivot to the left and right, settle, walk forward to Point #4, stop and dismount your horse. Walk to your outgoing Queen, select a question from bucket, read the question to yourself and hand it back to the Queen. She will ask you the question out loud; this question will only be repeated once. When answering your question, turn to both the audience and the judges. After you answer the question, mount your horse and exit the arena.

Contestants will not be allowed to share the same horse or change horses nor will contestants be allowed to practice on the day of the Judging. There will be an allotted time for contestants to warm up their horses on competition day. Contestants are allowed to change tack for the barrel pattern.



MCFLA Rodeo Queen Flag Pattern

Ride Pattern As Follows holding a Flag:

- A. Walk in the alley way and turn right as you enter the arena continue on to the middle of Chute # 3 and Chute # 4.
- B. Turn left at Chute # 3 and Chute # 4 and continue walking until you reach the center of the arena.
- C. Stop and wait for the judge to signal you.
- D. Upon receiving a signal from the Judge, lope to the right continue in a lope to the left and lope a circle around the entire arena.
- E. Once you have made a complete circle come back to the center of the arena, facing south and Stop.
- F. Stand still until the Judge signals you.
- G. Upon being signaled, walk straight to the fence, turn left and walk out of the arena
